

A'bad private schools steal the show in CBSE Class X

Ahmedabad: The Central Board for Secondary Education (CBSE) declared the class 10 results on Tuesday evening. Though the overall state result was not available, private schools in Ahmedabad again stole the show.

The Delhi Public School (DPS) posted a hundred per cent result. In all, 120 students took the CBSE class 10 exams from the school and all of them have passed with a first class. Pallavi Shah, with 96.8 per cent, was the school topper.

It was a 100 per cent result for 74 students who appeared in the central board exams from Prakash High School too. All of them have passed with a first class and Karan Jhaveri topped the school with 90 per cent marks.

Out of a 116 students, who took the board exams from the Maharaja Agrasen School, a 112 have passed with a first class. The school posted an overall result of 99.14 per cent, with one student passing with compartment. Aastha Mehta was the school topper with 93.83 per cent marks.
